



WINTER WORK (DECEMBER – FEBRUARY)		
Task	Notes	
Send "thank you" notes and bluebird photos to key folks		
Check Wisconsin Bluebird to see if need to renew membership		
Consider making a tax-deductible donation to BRAW		
Repair nest boxes and add predator guards		
Build or buy replacement nest boxes		
Consider skylight nest boxes for sparrow problem areas		
Check monitoring data for nest boxes to move		
Develop a plan for managing your nest boxes		
Review online videos about bluebirds		
Start a journal of your bluebird year		
Identify potential places for new trails		
Get permission to install nest boxes in cemeteries, parks, etc.		
Buy supplies for installations and managing pests, (e.g. scent trees, permethrin, etc.)		
Make sure monitoring forms are prepared for the season		
Write an article or submit photos and idea to Wisconsin Bluebird editor		





SPRING FORWARD (MARCH – MAY)			
Task	Notes		
Move problem nest boxes			
Put up nest boxes at new locations			
Make sure nest box numbers are readable or redo			
Check <i>Wisconsin Bluebird</i> to see if need to renew membership			
Give copies of the <i>Wisconsin Bluebird</i> to trail contacts, landowners, etc.			
Start monitoring nest boxes for first arrivals			
Clear new growth weeds away from around poles and posts			
Make sure nest boxes are still pointing east			
Contact local newspaper, association newsletter editor about doing an article			
Attach house wren guards where a problem			
Take a friend, landowner or contact along on a trail run			
Control for any pests that are endangering adults, eggs or chicks			
Take photos of nesting activities without disturbing bluebirds			
Share photos with landowners, managers, etc.			
Clean out abandoned, finished fledging and invasive species nests			



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SUMMER SUPPORT (JUNE – AUGUST)		
Task	Notes	
Clean boxes for second nestings		
Repeat any pest control procedures as necessary		
Cut any weeds and brush		
Make sure boxes have adequate ventilation		
Check <i>Wisconsin Bluebird</i> to see if need to renew membership		
Give copies of the <i>Wisconsin Bluebird</i> to trail contacts, landowners, etc.		
Update monitoring data		
Take a family members, friend, student etc., along on trail trip		
Check new places for establishing a trail		
Get permission for setting up trail		
Start summarizing data		
Check nest boxes that need repairs or replacement		
Enter the BRAW photo contest		
Clean boxes for second nestings		
Repeat any pest control procedures as necessary
